The Elections (Keys and Local Authorities) Act 2020 provides that a person who is or will be entitled to vote at an election may apply to the Returning Officer of their constituency to vote by post.

Applications to be treated as a postal voter must be made on an Application for a Postal Vote form, which must be submitted to the relevant Returning Officer:
